THE LEAGUE OF OPPORTUNITY

Currently in its 48th season, the North American Hockey League (NAHL) began as a small bus league in Michigan, and has grown into the largest and oldest USA Hockey-sanctioned junior hockey circuit with 31 teams representing some of the nation's best collegiate development programs.

The NAHL's proven pathway for young adults between the ages of 16-20 stems from the commitment of the best owners, coaches and players in the country. Each season, hundreds of collegiate and professional scouts attend NAHL games and events, continuing the league's proven track record of moving players on to the next level. During the 2021-22 season, a total of 360 NAHL players have committed to play NCAA hockey.

The goal of junior hockey is to promote, develop and administer the domestic USA Hockey program for junior-aged players and teams. The NAHL is one of only two non pay-to-play leagues in the country. Teams provide a competitive opportunity for the elite player to develop throughout their career.

The reach and exposure of the North American Hockey League spreads nationwide with 31 teams in 18 states stretching from Alaska to Maine.

THE FAMILY OF LEAGUES

Under the North American Hockey League umbrella, the North American 3 Hockey League and North American Prospects Hockey League provide exposures opportunities for players looking to reach the NAHL.

The North American 3 Hockey League (NA3HL) is the only USA Hockey-sanctioned Tier III junior league in the country and serves as one of the top training grounds in the country by providing the best coaching, exposure and developmental vehicles available for student-athletes in its classification.

The North American Prospects Hockey League (NAPHL) has established itself as one of the premier grounds for development and exposure at the youth hockey level. The success of teams on the national stage, as well as the success of NAPHL at the next levels of hockey is further proof that the NAPHL is redefining exposure and has elevated itself to one of the top training grounds for development and opportunity.

Both the NA3HL and NAPHL are operated by the NAHL's experienced staff and provides an organized and competitive experience guaranteed to benefit all of the participating student-athletes.





USA HOCKEY'S ADM

The ladder of development begins with falling in love with the game at a young age. Learning the game and having fun. USA Hockey's American Development Model is an athlete-centered, coach-enhanced, administrator-supported framework that aims to help all individuals realize their athletic potential and utilize sort as a path toward an active and healthy lifestyle.

THE NAPHL - AAA HOCKEY

As athletes grow older, the opportunities to play in more competitive environments increases. The NAPHL has established itself as one of the premier grounds for development and exposure. The members of the NAPHL have teams at the 18U, 16U, 15U, and 14U level. Some organizations have 13U, 12U and 11U programs as well. These are some of the best hockey



The ladder of development starts with the USA Hockey American Development Model. It then transitions to AAA or Tier I youth hockey like the NAPHL. From there athletes can join the junior hockey ranks where they will compete for championships but also college commitments to a NCAA institution. The very best of the best may compete against some of the best in the world in the NHL

institutions in the country at developing their players so they can be at their best now and also prepare them for the next stage of their hockey careers.

THE NAHL - JUNIOR HOCKEY

The top youth players in the country then move on to junior hockey. No other Midget Tier I league has had more players play in the NAHL than the NAPHL.

Youth players can reach the NAHL in a variety of ways. The first way a player can reach the NAHL is by signing a tender with an NAHL club. A tender is a contract, of sorts, a player signs announcing his intentions to play for that particular NAHL team and that NAHL team only. Once a player signs a tender with an NAHL team, his playing rights belong to that team within the NAHL and he may not be recruited by any other NAHL team. Each team is granted 10 tenders - plus or minus any trades - which become active on Nov. 1. Tendered players are not eligible for the NAHL draft.

Youth players can also be drafted in the annual NAHL Draft that is held in June each year. Players that go undrafted must contact the individual NAHL teams regarding tryout procedures. Undrafted and non-tendered players are eligible to try out for any NAHL team. Many free-agent players earn roster spots in tryout camps, and therefore are a very important part of an NAHL's recruiting process.

Players can also attend the annual NAHL Combines held throughout the country each Spring as all NAHL clubs have scouts in attendance. Players can be offered tenders, invites to tryouts and can also get face-to-face interaction with NAHL coaches.

THE NUMBERS

- 48th season of operation in 2022-23. NAHL began as a small league in the Midwest during 1975-76 season.
- Only USA Hockey-sanctioned Tier II Junior league boasting 29 teams in 17 states from across North America (AK, CT, IL, LA, MA, MD, ME, MO, MN, ND, NJ, NM, OK, PA, SD, TX, WI).

- Of the 50+ players nominated for the 2022 Hobey Baker Award, 17 were alumni that previously played in the NAHL before moving onto play in NCAA Division I hockey.
- Alum Dryden McKay won the Hobey Baker Award in 2022.
- Five (5) players with NAHL ties selected in the 2022 NHL Draft.
- In the last 10 years, 44 NAHL players have been selected in the NHL Draft.
- 57 NAHL alumni begins 2022-23 season on NHL rosters.
- 80+ NAHL alumni attended NHL Development Camps in 2022.
- Three league events: NAHL Showcase, NAHL Top Prospects Tournament, and Robertson Cup attract hundreds of scouts.

OUR HISTORY

Celebrating its 14th season in 2022-23, the North American Prospects Hockey League (NAPHL) is made up of three Leagues: T1ER League (Tier 1), SHOW League (Tier I/ II), and the FALL League (September / October Season).

The NAPHL has enjoyed a record-breaking amount of advancement in recent seasons which is highlights by a large amount of advancement of players to the NAHL. In 2021, the NAPHL had a record 89 players tendered or drafted in the NAHL. Plus 123 additional players that were tendered or drafted into the NA3HL. Since 2020, no other USA Hockey Midget Tier I league has had more players play in the NAHL than the NAPHL.

The NAPHL's T1ER League is comprised of teams that compete in a full NAPHL season at the highest level for USA Hockey. This includes strategically located and scheduled showcases each season. Historically, the majority of NAPHL players recruited by NAHL teams come from the T1ER League, which includes over 60 NAPHL tenders per season.

The successful advancement of T1ER players is due to the internal mechanisms the NAHL has created exclusively for the members of thee NAPHL. In addition, the T1ER League participates in events that are in conjunction with the NAHL Showcase and the NAHL Top Prospects Tournament, which each draw hundreds of scouts annually.

The NAPHL's SHOWCASE (SHOW) League is for Tier I and Tier II teams from all over North America looking to showcase their players at NAPHL events. It includes teams from some of the strongest Tier II leagues in the United States like the Central States Developmental Hockey League (CSDHL).

The SHOW provides teams with the best opportunity to showcase and advance their players, which has enhanced the ladder of development and increased number of opportunities between the NAHL, NA3HL, and NAPHL, which includes an exclusive tendering system in addition to the NAHL and NA3HL Drafts.

NAPHL SUCCESS STORY: DUSTY GEREGACH

The North American Prospects Hockey League has produced a number of Division I players as well as many players who worked their way to the professional ranks. One example of the ladder of development is Dustin Geregach.

The defenseman from McKees Rocks, Pennsylvania stayed close to home for his youth hockey playing days, joining the Esmark Stars organization in 2018, making their 18U roster as a 17 year old. In his first season of AAA hockey, the defenseman found the back of the net three times and finished the 16 game campaign with 16 points. He would chip in an assist during the three game playoff run from his Esmark team that postseason. He would be selected to play at the NAHL 18U Top Prospects Tournament representing the Eastern portion of the NAPHL.

In his 18 year old season, the blue liner once again had a solid season from the back end, contributing three goals and 11 points in 16 regular season contests. He was named to the NAPHL All-Star game and signed a tender with the Johnstown Tomahawks of the North American Hockey League.

Geregach saved his best hockey for last as the defenseman dominated in the 2020 Dixon Cup playoffs. In just five games, Geregach logged three goals and eight points, including an assist on the game winning overtime goal in the quarterfinals.

After a successful youth hockey career, Geregach made the jump to junior hockey with Johnstown in the fall of 2020. He picked up his first point in his first game and would have three points through his first six games. He would have to wait until March 5, 2021 to net his first junior goal, a power play goal in a 4-1 win over the Danbury Jr. Hat Tricks. Geregach would go on to play 49 games in his rookie season, finishing the campaign with the one goal and 17 points. He was named to the NAHL Top Prospects Tournament and represented the East Division.

It was at the NAHL Showcase in 2021 where Geregach took the next step in his hockey career. He logged a goal and four points at the event and made his name known to colleges across the country. The Johnstown defenseman would get off to a remarkable start to his final junior season as he registered a point in 18 of the 28 games he played.

Right before the Christmas holiday, Geregach would commit to Mercyhurst University and join the team in for the second semester of the 2021-22 season. That would ultimately bring an end to Geregach's junior season and career. He finished his final season with five goals and 19 points in 28 games. Giving him six goals and 36 points in 67 career NAHL games.

Geregach is another example of the ladder of development at work. Starting in the NAPHL, advancing to the NAHL and then going on to make a NCAA Division I commitment.



As the North American Hockey League season reaches the midway point of the 2022-23 season, the top players in the league are starting to separate themselves from the middle of the pack. NAPHL alums find themselves up and down the NAHL leader board in points with the following names ranked inside the top 30.

Branden Piku - Maryland Black Bears: Branden Piku made a name for himself during the 2018-19 NAPHL season with the Meijer AAA (now Biggby Coffee AAA program) as his "Michigan" goal during the NAHL Showcase got him on Sportscenter. In 2020, the Michigan native burst into the NAHL with the Maryland Black Bears. He scored six goals and 13 points in 28 games his rookie season. In his first full year with the club, he was nearly a point-per-game player as he notched 18 goals and 50 points in 57 contests. In his third and final junior season, Piku has lit the lamp 14 times and has 33 points through 30 games this year. He is committed to Lake Superior State University.

playing his 15U season with the New Jersey Jr. Titans. The forward dominated his time in the NAPHL as in 12 total games, he scored 14 goals and had 28 points. 

Aiden Westin - Anchorage Wolverines: Anchorage native Aiden Westin spent three years in the NAPHL before breaking through into the NAHL. The forward racked up 21 goals and 60 points in 56 games. He was sensational for the Wolverines in his first junior season as his 51 points ranked third on the club. In his final junior season, he's been even better as he currently ranks tied for fifth in the NAHL with 43 points in just 37 games. His 19 goals are tied for eighth most in the league.



The North American Prospects Hockey League has produced a number of Division I players as well as many players who worked their way to the professional ranks. One example of the ladder of development is Jack Anderson.

The defenseman from St. Louis, Missouri spent his entire youth playing career in the St. Louis area. Back in 2017-18, Anderson got his first taste of the NAPHL with the CarShield AAA program at the 15U level. He appeared in 13 total games in his first season.

The following year Anderson played for the 16U team at CarShield AAA. He was limited to just six games but had two points during that time.

In his first year at the 18U level, Anderson started to see signs of improvement in his game. He played in 20 total games including the postseason and found the back of the net twice and finished the campaign with 5 points.

In his final year of youth hockey, Anderson took off. He appeared in 29 regular season games for the CarShield AAA 18U team and in that time he would score eight times and ended up with 18 points. At the 2021 Dixon Cup, Anderson came up with a goal and an assist in the four game event.
