OUR HISTORY

Celebrating its 14th season in 2022-23, the North American Prospects Hockey League (NAPHL) is made up of three Leagues: T1ER League (Tier 1), SHOW League (Tier I/ II), and the FALL League (September / October Season).

The NAPHL has enjoyed a record-breaking amount of advancement in recent seasons which is highlights by a large amount of advancement of players to the NAHL. In 2021, the NAPHL had a record 89 players tendered or drafted in the NAHL. Plus 123 additional players that were tendered or drafted into the NA3HL. Since 2020, no other USA Hockey Midget Tier I league has had more players play in the NAHL than the NAPHL.

The NAPHL's T1ER League is comprised of teams that compete in a full NAPHL season at the highest level for USA Hockey. This includes strategically located and scheduled showcases each season. Historically, the majority of NAPHL players recruited by NAHL teams come from the T1ER League, which includes over 60 NAPHL tenders per season.

The successful advancement of T1ER players is due to the internal mechanisms the NAHL has created exclusively for the members of thee NAPHL. In addition, the T1ER League participates in events that are in conjunction with the NAHL Showcase and the NAHL Top Prospects Tournament, which each draw hundreds of scouts annually.

The NAPHL's SHOWCASE (SHOW) League is for Tier I and Tier II teams from all over North America looking to showcase their players at NAPHL events. It includes teams from some of the strongest Tier II leagues in the United States like the Central States Developmental Hockey League (CSDHL).

The SHOW provides teams with the best opportunity to showcase and advance their players, which has enhanced the ladder of development and increased number of opportunities between the NAHL, NA3HL, and NAPHL, which includes an exclusive tendering system in addition to the NAHL and NA3HL Drafts.

NAPHL ALUMS MAKING THEIR MARK IN NAHL

As the North American Hockey League season reaches the midway point of the 2022-23 season, the top players in the league are starting to separate themselves from the middle of the pack. NAPHL alums find themselves up and down the NAHL leader board in points with the following names ranked inside the top 30.

Branden Piku - Maryland Black Bears: Branden Piku made a name for himself during the 2018-19 NAPHL season with the Meijer AAA (now Biggby Coffee AAA program) as his "Michigan" goal during the NAHL Showcase got him on Sportscenter. In 2020, the Michigan native burst into the NAHL with the Maryland Black Bears. He scored six goals and 13 points in 28 games his rookie season. In his first full year with the club, he was nearly a point-per-game player as he notched 18 goals and 50 points in 57 contests. In his third and final junior season, Piku has lit the lamp 14 times and has 33 points through 30 games this year. He is committed to Lake Superior State University.



Current Northeast Generals forward and NAPHL alum Jake LaRusso is currently tied for third in the NAHL with 46 points.

Jake LaRusso - Northeast Generals: The native Colts
Neck, New Jersey has had a long NAHL career after
playing his 15U season with the New Jersey Jr. Titans. The forward dominated his time
in the NAPHL as in 12 total games, he scored 14 goals and had 28 points. LaRusso has
appeared in the NAHL the last five seasons, spending most of his time in New Jersey with
the Titans, he spent time with the North Iowa Bulls last season and started this year there
before being traded to the Northeast Generals. LaRusso had 27 goals and 69 points in 124
career games with the Titans. He grabbed another seven goals and 25 points in 44 games
with the Bulls before finding his stride this year with the Generals. In just 33 games with
his new team, the veteran forward has 26 goals and 45 points, giving him the league lead
in goals and his point total third most in the NAHL. In total, LaRusso has appeared in 201
NAHL games and has logged 60 goals and 139 points.

Jackson Reineke - Anchorage Wolverines: From Fairbault, Minnesota, Jackson Reineke spent parts of four seasons in the NAPHL. He played with the 16U team as a 15 year old back in 2017-18. He then played for the 18U team for the next three seasons, finishing his youth career with 21 goals and 44 points in 67 total games. He would be on the roster for the inaugural Anchorage Wolverines team that went all the way to the Robertson Cup National Championship, with Reineke scoring the overtime winner in their semifinal series against the St. Cloud Norsemen. To date, the forward has appeared in 91 NAHL games, potting 28 goals and 75 points.

Aiden Westin - Anchorage Wolverines: Anchorage native Aiden Westin spent three years in the NAPHL before breaking through into the NAHL. The forward racked up 21 goals and 60 points in 56 games. He was sensational for the Wolverines in his first junior season as his 51 points ranked third on the club. In his final junior season, he's been even better as he currently ranks tied for fifth in the NAHL with 43 points in just 37 games. His 19 goals are tied for eighth most in the league.

What is a tender?

A tender is a contract, of sorts, a player signs announcing his intentions to play for the particular NAHL team and that NAHL team only. Once a player signs a tender with an NAHL team, his playing rights belong to that team within the NAHL and he may not be recruited by any other NAHL team. Each team is granted ten (10) tenders - plus or minus any trades - which became active on November 1, 2022. Tendered players are not eligible for the 2023 NAHL Draft.



NAPHL Grads Participating in this year's NAHL Top Prospects

The North American Prospects Hockey League has a proven track record of developing young players on moving to the next level of competition. Coming into the 2023 NAHL Top Prospects Tournament at the UPMC Lemieux Sports Complex in Pennsylvania, over 16% of players selected to participate and showcase their talents in front of NCAA and NHL scouts had prior experience in playing in the NAPHL. Here's a look at a few highlighted players from that list.

Conner Brown, D, Janesville Jets (NAPHL 2018-2020) - Another NAPHL alum with a Dixon Cup in his trophy case is Janesville's Conner Brown. Playing in just his first NAHL season, Brown has been a staple on the Jets blue line. He has scored three times while setting up goals on 19 other occasions to give him 22 points. With that Brown also has a +10 rating, making him more than deserving of a spot at the NAHL's Top Prospects Tournament.

J.J. Grainda, F, Chippewa Steel (NAPHL 2020-2021) - Hailing from Carmel, Indiana, Grainda has spent the last two hockey seasons in Chippewa with the Steel. Playing 59 out of a possible 60 games as a rookie, Grainda potted 16 goals and 34 points. He's followed that up with a tremendous sophomore season as he is currently on pace to exceed those numbers. Through 33 games in the 2022-23 campaign, Grainda has found the back of the net 13 times and has 23 points.

Calvin Hanson, F, Bismarck Bobcats (NAPHL, 2020-2021) - A native of Hallock, Minnesota, the forward is currently in his second, and final, season of junior hockey with the Bismarck Bobcats. He

is currently sitting at 29 points (13 goals and 16 assists) through 37 games played. He was named the NAHL's Central Division Star of the Week for the week ending January 22 as he picked up two goals and two assists in two games against the North Iowa Bulls. To date, Hanson has appeared in 90 career NAHL games and has 23 goals and 62 points in that time.

Jake LaRusso, F, Northeast Generals (NAPHL 2017-2018) - The native Colts Neck, New Jersey has had a long NAHL career after playing his 15U season with the New Jersey Jr. Titans. LaRusso has appeared in the NAHL the last five seasons, spending most of his time in New Jersey with the Titans, he spent time with the North Iowa Bulls last

season and started this year there before being traded to the Northeast Generals. LaRusso had 27

goals and 69 points in 124 career games with the Titans. He grabbed another seven goals and 25 points in 44 games with the Bulls before finding his stride this year with the Generals. In just 33 games with his new team, the veteran forward has 26 goals and 45 points, giving him the league lead in goals and his point total third most in the NAHL. In total, LaRusso has appeared in 201 NAHL games and has logged 60 goals and 139 points.

Mason Mara, F, Lone Star Brahmas (NAPHL 2018-2020) - The Brahmas forward has spent a lot of time in the NAHL family of leagues over the last five seasons. The Ocoee, Florida native spent

two full seasons in the NAPHL with the Florida Alliance, playing in 55 total games. He then spent a season and a half with the Texas Brahmas of the North American 3 Hockey League before finally getting called up for good to the Lone Star Brahmas of the NAHL. He appeared in 60 career games in the NA3HL, potting 18 goals and 50 points. After being called up to Lone Star during the fall last season, Mara has played in 67 NAHL games, scoring 12 times with 24 points. He is currently tied

for the Brahmas team lead in goals with 11 and is second with 21 points.

Drake Morse, F, Shreveport Mudbugs (NAPHL 2019-2021) - After a pair of seasons with Meijer AAA (now Biggby Coffee AAA) which included a Dixon Cup championship, Drake Morse found himself on the roster of the defending Robertson Cup champion Shreveport Mudbugs in the fall of 2021. He appeared in 48 games and finished his rookie campaign with six goals and 15 points. In just 37 games this season, Morse has shattered those numbers, doubling his goals with 12 and more than doubling his points with 33. From Grand Rapids, Michigan, Morse will be looking to finish his junior

career with another championship and an NCAA commitment as well.

Nolan Suggs, G, El Paso Rhinos (NAPHL 2017-2020) - The 6'1" goaltender from White Lake, Michigan has spent two full seasons in the NAHL. The first was with the Jamestown Rebels where he appeared in 39 of his team's 60 games. After Joe Coombs' departure from Jamestown and subsequent hire in El Paso, Suggs former coach became his current coach again. Coombs has shown considerable faith in Suggs, starting him in 75% of the Rhinos games this year. His faith in Suggs has been rewarded. The netminder has a career record of 32-25-5. sporting a 2.65 goals against average and a .918 save percentage. In his one trip to the postseason, Suggs was even better as his goals against fell to 2.40 and his save percentage increased to .930. He'll look to make his mark at the Top Prospects Tournament and earn his NCAA commitment.




