About The NAPHL

In its first season, the North American Prospects Hockey League is made up of 24 programs from across the country which compete at the Tier I Midget AAA level.

Comprised of five events in which the 34 teams participate at the Midget Major (20 teams) and Midget Minor (14 teams) levels for a league championship, the North American Prospects Hockey League season culminates with an NAPHL Top Prospects Tournament in early May.

NAPHL member teams will compete in all five events, and a special player procurement system has been implemented by the NAHL, the only USA Hockey-sanctioned Tier II Junior A league in the country.

The five USA Hockey-sanctioned NAPHL events utilize the USA Hockey Officiating Development Program and are designed to maximize the exposure of all the Midget student-athletes through the NAHL's high-profile recruiting events, which attract hundreds of college, junior and professional scouts.



Events

September 17-20, 2009 • Schwan Super Rink • Blaine, Minnesota

Held in conjunction with the NAHL Showcase Tournament, which attracts close to 200 junior, college and professional coaches and scouts.

October 9-12, 2009 • Rex-Plex • St. Peters, Missouri

A centrally-located event hosted in a St. Louis suburb attracting coaches and scouts from all levels, including the NCAA, the NAHL and other U.S. junior programs.

December 3-6, 2009 • ELS Sports Centre • Rochester, New York

A heavily-scouted showcase held in the backyard of many of the top junior programs and colleges on the East Coast.

January 15-18, 2010 • Ice Cube • Ann Arbor, Michigan

Held in conjunction with the NAHL Top Prospects Tournament, which has quickly evolved into a can't-miss event for college and professional scouts.

February 12-15, 2010 • Sharks Ice • San Jose, California

The league's only showcase on the West Coast will crown the league's champions while providing players plenty of exposure to junior programs and colleges alike.

May 6-9, 2010 • Town Toyota Center • Wenatchee, Washington

A season-ending NAPHL Top Prospects Tournament, which will be held in conjunction with the highly-scouted NAHL Robertson Cup Championship Tournament.

Exposure

The NAPHL prides itself on the exposure and promotion of all of its student-athletes to junior, college and professional scouts and coaches across North America.

In addition to comprehensive scouting guides and player profiles available at each of the NAPHL's five events, updates on the league and its players are distributed weekly via e-mail to an extensive list of junior, college and professional teams.

Information is also highlighted through the league's Web site, NAPHL.net, where coaches and scouts can access detailed player information, including real-time statistics provided by Point-streak.
